The **Corona Companion Animal Rescue Effort – CCARE** is a non-profit organization dedicated to aiding lost and abandoned pets, while promoting responsible pet ownership, pet population control through proactive spay/neutering assistance, and assisting in the proper treatment and care of animals through educational programs.

### **Off Site Adoptions**

Our off site adoption program managed by CCARE volunteers and Animal Shelter employees helps adopt and promote shelter services through the local PetSmart stores and local community events.

### **Pet Food/Care Items “Community Donations”**

Our shelter provides a supply of pet food to pet owners on a limited income who otherwise would be unable to keep or feed their companion animals. The shelter works diligently to secure food donations so that we can continue this vital service in the community.

### **Pet Therapy**

Our volunteers visit nursing homes and long term care facilities in Corona with their animals. The animals provide physical and emotional therapy for the residents of the various facilities.

### **Micro-Chipping of Animals**

The Corona Animal Shelter offers to microchip animals to provide a permanent identification to protect the animal from being lost or stolen. The Corona Animal Shelter offers microchipping services to any pet owner at a significantly reduced fee. CCARE also donates microchips to assist in the microchipping of senior citizen’s pets.

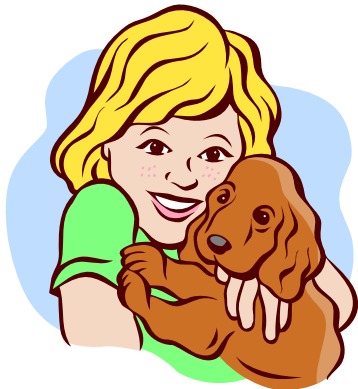
### **Santa Paws**

In conjunction with local businesses, the shelter participates in the “Santa Paws” Promotion. Animal Control Officers dress as “Santa Paws” and have pictures taken with local pets and their owners with “Santa Paws.” \$5.00 from every photo package purchased was donated to the Corona Companion Animal Rescue Effort.
